And it aims to train the students on how to provide primary care to save a life of any person who may be exposed to emergency health cases which is considered as an initial aid until a specialized person arrives and provide medical care for the patient or to be transferred to the nearest hospital or medical clinic.

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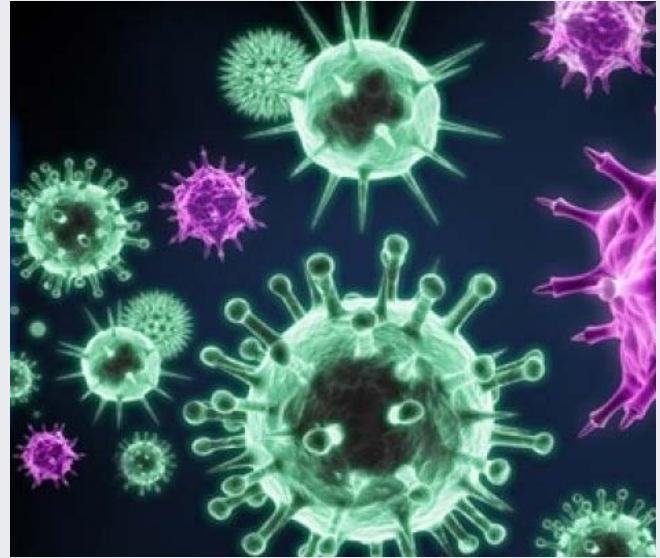
A Virtual lecture on immunity boosting delivered by AAU and Mediclinic
